

Today, in the Gospel, we hear the story of the Woman at the Well in Samaria. Little is told of her in the western tradition, but in the Orthodox and Syrian Churches she is commemorated on the 20th March

In those Churches it is recorded that the apostles of Christ baptised her and gave her the name 'Photini' which means 'the enlightened one.' She is remembered by the Church as a Holy Martyr and Equal to the Apostles. After Ss. Peter and Paul were martyred, St. Photini and her family left their homeland of Sychar, in Samaria, to travel to Carthage to proclaim the Gospel of Christ there.

During Nero's reign, he had her sons and sisters horribly tortured and martyred, and imprisoned her for 20 days, after which he suimmoned her and asked if she would now relent and offer sacrifice to the idols. St. Photini spat in his face, and laughing at him, said, "O most impious of the blind, you profligate and stupid man! Do you think me so deluded that I would consent to renounce my Lord Christ and instead offer



sacrifice to idols as blind as you?" Nero gave orders to throw St. Photini down a well, where she surrendered her soul to God in the year 66. *(The image is from an ancient Syrian Manuscript)*






Bible Reading at home: During the Confirmation Course this year, as I always do, I mentioned that the Bible is not a volume to be read from cover to cover because it is not written chronologically.

This edition is designed to be read over the course of the year for about 15 minutes each day. It includes illustrations, maps, charts, diagrams, a timeline, and devotional articles; which are very useful aids to study and prayer.

The See of Sheffield - A Statement by the Bishop of Wakefield, Chairman of The Society: The predominant responses to last week's news regarding the See of Sheffield have been dismay at the nature of the campaign that was mounted against the outcome of the Church's process for discerning God's call to the See of Sheffield, and sorrow at the result of that campaign.

We are encouraged that so many - women and men; bishops, clergy and laity: liberals, evangelicals and catholics - have gone further, pointing out that, as the Archbishop of York said in his statement, what has happened "clearly does not reflect" the 2014 settlement that paved the way for women to be ordained as bishops while securing an honoured place within the Church of England for those who, for theological reasons, are unable to receive their sacramental ministry. This strong and widespread affirmation of the 2014 settlement gives us hope that, in the providence of God, some good may yet come out of an awful situation.

In his statement, Archbishop

Sentamu stressed that when we disagree, we should "disagree Christianly, remembering at all times that our identity is in Christ alone". The response of the clergy and people of The Society in the Diocese of Sheffield to the provocation they have experienced has been exemplary. We wish to assure them of our full support at this difficult time. We are grateful to all of the bishops of The Society for their ministry in building up those of their clergy and people across the Church of England for whom this has been a bitter blow.

The need now is to build on the growing consensus in support of the Five Guiding Principles. The statements made by Archbishop Sentamu and a number of other diocesan bishops are very helpful indeed. In due course they will need to be accompanied by action to restore confidence in the House of Bishops' Declaration and to correct definitively the false statements that have been made about the Declaration, the Five Guiding Principles, and the beliefs of traditional catholics. The Executive Committee of Forward in Faith has begun to consider what actions need to be taken, and by whom. We are engaged in discussions with others and will report further as plans develop.

Reading at Mass, a polite request: would readers please announce the readings in the way in which they are printed in the Lectionary, e.g. using today's readings: "A reading from the Book of Exodus" or "A reading from the second Letter of St Paul to the Romans."

The reading of the Scriptures is something that is part of Common Prayer. That is, it is done uniformly. It isn't done to indicate some particular knowledge that we might think lesser mortals may not know.

The Scriptures should NEVER be introduced as being "taken from" - as our Lord told us that nothing would be taken away from Scripture. Nor should

Donations: Following the step of faith taken by the PCC last year in deciding to go ahead with the installation of a new heating system at All Saints, an appeal was launched by the Rector for donations for All Saints Fabric Fund. I am delighted to announce that following a lot of hard work with the Small Lottery before Christmas, with a number of generous donations, and the receipt of a large donation transferred to the PCC accounts last weekend, the amount in the Fabric Fund is £14,000. I am also delighted to report that in the past week a donation of £250 towards each of the 'Items of a Lasting Nature' Funds of our Parish Churches has also been received.

2018 - Parish Celebration: Bishop Jonathan wants us to mark the important part our Parish played in the Oxford Movement with a major celebration for both Parish Churches. It seems fitting to do this next year when it will be 160 years since Rector Perceval died and when we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Re -Consecration of the now St Mary & St Giles Church

As part of these celebrations it would be good to produce an historical record of the Parish. There have been small publications in the past, but these are now out of print.
