

Reflection prior to Mass

As we come nearer to the commemoration of the death and resurrection of the Lord, the Church places before us for our prayerful consideration the theme of new life out of death. Messy Church at All Saints: Sister Janet and All Saints Churchwardens have been working together to plan our first 'Messy Church' celebration which will be at 3:00pm on the Monday of Holy Week (15th April) in All Saints Church. Do please invite friends and neighbours who live near you to bring their children along for what promises to be a wonderful opportunity to prepare for the observances of Holy Week and Easter. In the meantime please do pray for this new initiative within our Parish. Initially we are aiming to hold similar celebrations each term. but if need arises then we will plan them on a more frequent basis.



Coffee Mornings at St Mary & St Giles:

Yesterday saw the start of the six Gardeners' Delight Coffee Mornings. All the monies raised will be for our Greater Access Project. We are now half way to our target of around £115k, so all the support you can give us over the next few months will help enormously.

With regard to this project we really do need to start to think of new ideas to raise the remainder of the funds for this first phase of the works for which faculty has bene granted. It has been suggested that we consider doing part of this first phase to provide disabled access at the west door and then the gallery extension later. However, the faculty was granted on the basis of this being one complete phase of the proiect, and the costs would significantly increase if they were separated.

'Thy Kingdom Come' Prayer Initiative: The Archbishops launched this prayer initiative lasting from Ascension Day to Pentecost some years ago, and it has now become a world-wide initiative. Last year we began to join in this initiative. This year the Archbishops have commissioned a booklet containing Morning Prayer, Midday Prayer, Evening Prayer &

Night Prayer for the ten days of prayer. This booklet is undated so that it can be used every year during this initiative. The cost per booklet is £1.99 - although if sufficient are order then the cost can be reduced to £1.50

School Academisation:

'Academisation Order' has been issued by the Regional Schools' Commissioner (RSC) for the present St Mary & St Giles School, following its distressing OFSTED Inspection results. This means that the school must join a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT) that can quickly support the school to effect rapid improvement. The choice of MAT is determined by RSC following discussion with interested parties, in this case the Diocese and the Local Authority. As a Voluntary Aided Church of England School it has to join a MAT that honours its religious foundation. So the 'Articles of Association,' which is the legal document that accompanies conversion to a MAT will have to have regard to that.

This is a very unsettling time for the school staff, as well as for parents and children, and, whilst the Diocese and Local Authority will have particular responsibilities to support the school through this process, I would want to encourage us all to pray for the School (the staff, pupils and parents) which, after 409 years as a Parish School, unfortunately now faces a very different structural and managerial future.

Confirmation - Young People's Classes: resume on: 29th April, 13th May, & 3rd June. The Confirmation Mass is at 7:30pm on Wednesday 5th June in St Mary & St Giles Church. There will be two follow up sessions after the Confirmation on 10th June and 24th June.

Confirmation Rehearsal: Fr Ross will hold a rehearsal for the Confirmation immediately after the Parish Mass on Sunday 2nd June in St Mary & St Giles.

New Green Chasuble & Stole for All Saints Church: Last Sunday, a new green chasuble and stole was blessed by Father Ross in memory of Eric Westley.

This was possible because of the kind and generous donations which were made by Eric's family and friends at his funeral in October 2018.

PARISH NEWS & NOTICES

From the Rector: during my spell in hospital in July of last year a further problem with my left lea was diagnosed that requires surgery, and which, it is believed, will relieve a third issue with that leg. I have been waiting since then for the surgery to take place. I recently received the news that the operation is scheduled for Monday 15th April - the Monday of Holy Week! Those of you who have been waiting for surgery will know only too well that asking for a different date can result in a huge delay. The Bishop and Archdeacon are both of the opinion that my health has to come first, that the surgery should not be delayed, and that I should undergo it on the date offered.

For almost a week after surgery I shall not be able to stand still for long periods, nor sit without my lea being up although I shall have to do lots of walking each day. This means the Holy Week liturgies will need to be covered by other clergy. I am very grateful to Fr Joseph for agreeing to Celebrate the Lituray on Holy Thursday and to Fr Ian Thomas for agreeing to celebrate the Lituray on Good Friday morning as well as the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. Sister Janet will lead the Devotional Service at All Saints on Good Friday afternoon. Fr Tunji has kindly agreed to Celebrate the said evening Masses in the earlier part of Holy Week, and Fr Gary Ecclestone will be celebrating the Mass on the Tuesday morning of Holy Week at All Saints.

I am hopeful that I shall be able to Celebrate the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter Day in both our Parish Churches.

During Holy Week there are many things to be done to prepare for each liturgy and I know that John, our Sacristan, and Dick, our Head Server, would be very grateful if offers of help were forthcoming. Naturally, I would be

grateful for your prayers. Fr Ross

This Morning - Vestry Meetings: I thought it would be useful to clarify the rules regarding the election of Churchwardens prior to these two meetings in our Parish Churches to elect candidates to the Office of Churchwarden.

Nominations in writing on the official form for the election of Churchwardens are to be received by the Incumbent 24 hours before the date of the Meeting of Parishioners (Vestry Meeting). The Incumbent can refuse to accept a nomination, and there are circumstances where certain people would not be permitted to stand for election, for example: where there are Safeguarding concerns, if someone had been declared bankrupt or subject to an IVA. Candidates must:

- (a) be on the church electoral roll
- (b) be actual communicants
- (c) be aged at least 21
- (d) not be disqualified.

It is not the 'congregation' that elects churchwardens but the Parishioners (so in reality every adult in the parish could turn up to vote - hence the Incumbents right to refuse a nomination).

At the Meeting of Parishioners the Incumbent announces the names of those who have been nominated, as well as who they have been nominated and seconded by; and states if he is prepared to accept their nomination or not.

If he refuses to accept a nomination he does so publicly so that person would be known to be unacceptable by all and sundry. In that, albeit unlikely, scenario the Incumbent announces who he is appointing as his Churchwarden and those present and qualified to vote elect A N Other. Those qualified to vote are those on the Electoral Roll of the Parish Church and those resident in the Parish

If the Incumbent has three or more nominations and he declares them all acceptable, then the Meeting of Parishioners proceeds to a vote. If there are two or less acceptable nominations then the Incumbent declares them elected unopposed.

Funeral Mass for Cyril Brown R.I.P.: Cyril's Funeral Mass will be held in St Mary & St Giles Church at 2:15pm on Tuesday 9th April followed by a Committal at the Oak Chapel, Crownhill Crematorium. Cyril's mortal remains will be received into church at 4:30pm on Monday 8th April. Please pray for the repose of his soul, and for Graham and Keith as their mourn the loss of their father. Jesu, mercy. Mary, pray.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting: this will take place this Thursday at 7:30pm in All Saints Church. Papers for the meeting are available in both Parish Churches.

Next Sunday - Palm Sunday: the Liturgy begins with all those who are fit and able meeting at the London Road Car Park at 9:30am for the Procession, by which we commemorate the Lord's Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem, to the Parish Church for the Dramatic Reading of the Passion Gospel and the Parish Mass.

The day will conclude with Evensong being celebrated at 6:00pm in All Saints Church.
