

NOVENA TO ST JOSEPH

This Friday the Feast of St Joseph the Worker is observed and there will be many Christians who will begin prayers on that day for nine days. A novena (from Latin: novem, "nine") is an ancient tradition of devotional praying in Christianity, consisting of private or public prayers repeated for nine successive days or weeks. During a novena, the devotees make petitions, implore favours, or obtain graces by worshipping Jesus Christ, and asking for intercessions of the Virgin Mary or the saints of the faith.
