

You get a wonderful opportunity from prayer to strengthen and deepen your relationship with our Creator and with your fellow human beings by praying for their needs as well as your own.

Now Christ our paschal Lamb is slain, The Lamb of God that knows no stain, The true oblation offered here, Our own unleavened bread sincere.

O thou, from whom hell's monarch flies, O great, O very Sacrifice, Thy captive people are set free, And endless life restored in thee.

To thee who, dead, again dost live, All glory, Lord, thy people give: All glory, as is ever meet, To Father and to Paraclete.

Two Psalms with a Canticle are said on Sunday one Psalm on subsequent weekdays

Sunday 10th May - Psalm 110 The Messiah, king and priest

"He must be king so that he may put all his enemies under his feet" (1 Cor 15:25).

Antiphon: The Lord has risen
