Therefore we, before him bending, this great sacrament revere; types and shadows have their ending, for the newer rite is here; faith, our outward sense befriending, makes the inward vision clear.

Glory let us give, and blessing, to the Father and the Son; honour, might and praise addressing, while eternal ages run; ever too his love confessing, who from both, with both is one.

The Priest rises, genuflects, and prays:

Lord our God, in this great sacrament, we come into the presence of Jesus Christ, your Son. Born of the Virgin Mary and crucified for our salvation. May we who declare our faith in this fountain of love and mercy

drink from it the water of everlasting life.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

#### Amen.

The Priest kneels, is vested in the Humeral Veil once again, rises, genuflects, and taking the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance makes the Sign of the Cross over the People imparting BENEDICTION upon them.

After Benediction, the Monstrance is replaced upon the altar, and the Priest kneels, is divested of the Humeral Veil, and leads the People in the 'DIVINE PRAISES' - the People repeating each petition after him:

Blessed be God.

Blessed be his holy name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.

Blessed be the name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be his most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in

the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in his angels and in his saints.

Following which, as the Blessed Sacrament is replaced in the Tabernacle, all sing:


