PARISH NOTICES

Parish Appeal: as has been previously announced the Sacristy Roof, rainwaters goods and exterior walls at St Mary & St Giles are in need of urgent repairs projected to cost over £50,000. It is hoped that we will be able to start the works in May this year. The Rector has managed to raise £35,000 by applying for grants, and the PCC has almost £7000 in the Fabric Fund. The Rector has also applied for grants from the 'Bucks Historic Churches Trust' and the 'Francis Coales Charitable Foundation,' but these are likely to be much smaller grants than those achieved so far. Without these essential repairs being undertaken the building is at risk of water ingress causing much more serious and more costly damage. If you know of other charitable trusts that might be willing to make grants, or if you wish to make a donation yourself, please have a word with either the Rector or Bob Scarff, our Treasurer, who will be able to give you further information. Thank you.

Welcome to the Parish Church where, after the example of the early church, we celebrate the Eucharist: the "apostles teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42)

"away with him, crucify him," & "we have no king but Caesar." Such was the fickleness of human nature then. Unfortunately it has not changed much, if at all, in the two thousand years that have since elapsed. So many are still fickle when it comes to choosing between Christ and the things of this world. Yet he knew all of this, and was still willing to carry the cross for us who are such unworthy mortals!

This very thought should put us all to shame, for what repayment does the very best of us make for the incredible love he has shown for us? We grumble and complain when some small cross is laid on our shoulders; we are full of laments if life is not running smoothly for us; we cannot understand why God should let certain things happen to us, his friends! But see for a moment what the lot of his beloved Son was on earth. Born and reared in extreme poverty; insulted and offended by those he wanted to teach; quickly forgotten by those he benefited by his miracles; hounded by his enemies, betrayed by one who had been his disciple for three years and who had sat at table with him that same night; deserted in his moment of trial by those very ones who had sworn undying allegiance to him. Then followed the torments wished on him by his enemies-those he had come to save; the mock trial and illegal condemnation; the scourging at the pillar; the crowning with thorns; the carrying of the cross and finally the three hours of intense torture and agony while his body hung on the cross! The next time we are tempted to grumble and complain about our sad lot. Let us look thoughtfully at a crucifix for a few moments!

INFORMATION



Safeguarding: Our Parish Churches have adopted and follow the Diocese of Oxford's recommended policies for the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults. Details of these policies and of our Safeguarding Officers are available on the noticeboards inside each Parish Church. Should you have any safeguarding concerns then please see one of them.

Restrictions During the Current Pandemic:

Unfortunately, we are required to observe the following restrictions:

- ٠ FACE MASKS: MUST BE WORN by all attending worship as required by Law, apart from the Priest and any Lay Ministers assisting him. N.B. IF YOU CANNOT WEAR A MASK FOR MEDICAL REASONS YOU MUST WEAR A FACE SHIELD.
- Only 3 or 4 Church Bells are permitted to be rung, because ringing chambers are not large enough for distancing requirements when a full team is present. The Tower Captain and Assistant must keep a record of who is present to ring on what dates and ensure that distancing is maintained on the staircase. Bell ringing practice is not permitted.
- Entry and exit to our Parish Churches entry via the West (Tower) Door and exit via the Parish Hall at St Mary & St Giles - entry via the South Porch and exit via the West (Tower) Door at All Saints
- There cannot be an **social gathering** in either of our Parish Churches before or after Mass social intercourse <u>may</u> take place in the churchyards before or after Mass.
- 'Shared' Mass cards are not permitted. Please do not take a copy for someone else - either retain it for your devotions at home, or place it in the bin provided at the exit points in both churches.
- Until further notice all communal singing, singing rehearsals and concerts are prohibited in all places of worship. It is now possible to have a small choir and Organ Music played.
- **Collections:** Cash donations and envelopes must be placed either in the large plinth donations box at St Mary & St Giles, or in the bowl by the south porch door at All Saints. We are not allowed to pass a collection plate/bag to one another
- **The Peace'** may not be shared physically. We may however join our own hands and bow to each other at The Peace.
- When going forward to receive Holy Communion at St Mary & St Giles please approach centre of the altar rail in single file via the main aisle, observing a two metre distance, and return to your place via the side aisle. At All Saints: again single file two metres apart but keeping to the south porch side of the main aisle on approaching the altar rail and returning to your place on the vestry side. N.B. in both churches Holy Communion must be received whilst standing and please extend your arms as far as you are able. Textile kneelers and cushions have had to be removed.
- 'Receiving Holy Communion' is in one kind, i.e. The Host. This must be received in the palms of our hands - not on the tongue.
- Please maintain a two metre distance from each other on approaching the altar rails and on leaving our churches after Mass. Lavatory Facilities. Strict hand-hygiene must be observed and hand-dryers only
- used. In the lavatory at each church there is a spray sanitiser and single use sanitising wipes for each user to wipe the seat, flush-handle, water taps, sink and door handle. Used wipes should be placed in the waste baskets provided.

All of these restrictions, whilst not what we would wish for, do not detract from the fact that we are able to receive the Lord in his Blessed Sacrament.

Reflection before Mass:

In the old liturgical calendar this Sunday would have been 'Passion Sunday' - the one before 'Palm Sunday.' So there are many references to the sufferings and death of Jesus in today's liturgy. Jesus learned to obey through suffering (second reading). In this Mass we ask him to teach us to obey God's will for us in our daily lives, even if the pathway be steep and rugged.
