Works to the Sacristy and Parish Office: from Monday 26th April a six week programme of works will commence to repair roofs, stonework, rainwater goods and windows to the Sacristy and Parish Office. I am delighted to be able to report that following my application to the Francis Coales Charitable Foundation, it has subject to a Trustees visit, awarded us a grant of £3000. This means that through the four applications I have made on the parish's behalf a total of £42,500 in grants has been made to the PCC for this project. With a very kind and generous offer of an interest free bridging loan over two years plus the almost £7000 unrestricted monies in the Fabric Fund, we can now ensure that these works are completed earlier than we had anticipated.

Welcome to the Parish Church where, after the example of the early church, we celebrate the Eucharist: the "apostles teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42)

The image of Christ as our Good Shepherd has always appealed to human nature. One of the earliest paintings of Christ in the Roman catacombs represents him as carrying an injured sheep on his shoulders. This is a manifestation of love which touches our innermost feelings. We do not mind being likened to sheep in this context. There is something guileless about a sheep, and at the same time a lot of foolishness. Does not this describe the vast majority of people, even many of those who openly oppose Christ? Is there not something very sheeplike about those who, because God gave us a limited intellect, think they know all things and need no further help from God? The sheep who thinks it knows as much, and even more, than the shepherd and sets out to fend for itself, is no more foolish than those who think they can do without God's revelation and God's Church.

Indeed we all act like sheep on many occasions, when it comes to the things that concern our spiritual welfare. We often ramble off from the flock to nibble at little bits of forbidden pasture. However, we have a Shepherd who understands us, one whose patience and love are infinite. He is always ready to go after us when we stray too far; his voice is constantly reaching out to us in missions, retreats, sicknesses, crosses and other various ways. How many times have we already felt his loving grace calling and helping us back to the safety of his fold?

There are many who are not so fortunate to know the one true God and his Son Jesus Christ, who either through no fault of their own or through their own fault do not hear his voice and do not know or follow him. This is an opportunity he gives us to show how we appreciate all he has done for us. He died on the cross to save the world. He wills everyone to profit by his death, and his statement "them also I must bring" is a direct appeal to us to cooperate with him in this work. Every Christian is a missionary. The very fact of living the Christian life in its entirety, in the midst of others, is of itself a powerful example to outsiders. It influences for good the lax Christian and the non-Christian. It makes them stop and think and look into their consciences. This is generally the first step on the road back to God.

INFORMATION



Safeguarding: Our Parish Churches have adopted and follow the Diocese of Oxford's recommended policies for the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults. Details of these policies and of our Safeguarding Officers are available on the noticeboards inside each Parish Church. Should you have any safeguarding concerns then please see one of them.

Restrictions During the Current Pandemic:

Unfortunately, we are required to observe the following restrictions:

- FACE MASKS: MUST BE WORN by all attending worship as required by Law, apart from the Priest and any Lay Ministers assisting him. N.B. IF YOU CANNOT WEAR A MASK FOR MEDICAL REASONS YOU MUST WEAR A FACE SHIELD.
- Only 3 or 4 **Church Bells** are permitted to be rung, because ringing chambers are not large enough for distancing requirements when a full team is present. The Tower Captain and Assistant must keep a record of who is present to ring on what dates and ensure that distancing is maintained on the staircase. Bell ringing practice is not permitted.
- Entry and exit to our Parish Churches entry via the West (Tower) Door and exit via the Parish Hall at St Mary & St Giles - entry via the South Porch and exit via the West (Tower) Door at All Saints
- There cannot be an **social gathering** in either of our Parish Churches before or after Mass brief social intercourse <u>may</u> take place in the churchyards before or after Mass.
- 'Shared' **Mass cards** are not permitted. Please do not take a copy for someone else – either retain it for your devotions at home, or place it in the bin provided at the exit points in both churches.
- Until further notice all **communal singing**, singing rehearsals and concerts are prohibited in all places of worship. It is now possible to have a small choir and Organ Music played a recessional hymn may be sung within in the churchyard.
- **Collections:** Cash donations and envelopes must be placed either in the large plinth donations box at St Mary & St Giles, or in the bowl by the south porch door at All Saints. We are not allowed to pass a collection plate/bag to one another
- 'The Peace' may not be shared physically. We may however join our own hands and bow to each other at The Peace, whilst saying the customary greeting.
- When going forward to receive Holy Communion at St Mary & St Giles please approach centre of the altar rail in single file via the main aisle, observing a two metre distance, and return to your place via the side aisle. At All Saints: again single file two metres apart but keeping to the south porch side of the main aisle on approaching the altar rail and returning to your place on the vestry side. N.B. in both churches Holy Communion must be received whilst standing and please extend your arms as far as you are able. Textile kneelers and cushions have had to be removed.
- 'Receiving Holy Communion' is in one kind, i.e. The Host. This must be received in the palms of our hands - not on the tongue.
- **Please maintain a two metre distance** from each other on approaching the altar rails and on leaving our churches after Mass. **Lavatory Facilities.** Strict hand-hygiene must be observed and hand-dryers only
- used. In the lavatory at each church there is a spray sanitiser and single use sanitising wipes for each user to wipe the seat, flush-handle, water taps, sink and door handle. Used wipes should be placed in the waste baskets provided.

All of these restrictions, whilst not what we would wish for, do not detract from the fact that we are able to receive the Lord in his Blessed Sacrament.
