Restrictions having been eased...

We return to a full celebration of Mass. Whilst no one is required to wear a mask, you may continue to do so if you prefer to, or if it would be sensible for you to do so because of a suppressed immune system. Whilst social distancing is no longer required please be considerate to those who request that distance still be observed.

There is still the opportunity to use the QR Code to register your attendance or the sheet upon which you can write your name and telephone number for those without a smartphone. However, no one is required to make use of them.

Shared Hymn Books and Mass Cards will remain out of use for the time being. All that you need to participate fully in the Mass can be found in this leaflet.

Kneelers have been replaced at the altar rails for those who are desirous of kneeling when receiving the Blessed Sacrament. A few of you indicated that you were desirous to resume consuming the Precious Blood of Christ from the Chalice. The priest will administer the Host at the centre of the altar rail, and a Chalice Assistant will administer the Precious Blood at the North Side of the altar rail. Both the priest and the chalice assistant will wear masks whilst distributing the Blessed Sacrament.

N.B. at All Saints, the priest will administer both forms of the Blessed Sacrament - to indicate your desire to receive the Precious Blood: having consumed the Host, look at the priest and bow your head, and he will then administer the Chalice to you.

All Saints Fete & Open Day: It is that time of year again! Please can anyone willing to, or interested in, helping at the Calverton Open Day / Fete on Sunday September 12th 2pm -4pm. Whilst we shall be concentrating on the major fund raisers this year, we would still very much appreciate offers of help in setting up and clearing away, and donations of books, cakes and other delicious eats. Please have a word with the Rector, Rita Wiseman or any member of All Saints, and with Jill Eales or Lesley Salter who are also involved. Thank you so much.

Young Christians: we would very much like to begin these important sessions again for our children on a Sunday morning during Mass. However, we do need more volunteers. Please have a word with Father Ross if you would like to know more about what this might involve. Starting again gives us the opportunity to consider new ideas, and it may be that a meeting of interested people could be helpful.
