

## THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Gifts of Bread and Wine are brought to the altar by the faithful. Then priest says the Offertory Prayers as we sing a hymn (either standing or sitting). A collection is taken and brought forward.

An Upper Room did our Lord prepare for those he loved until the end: and his disciples still gather there to celebrate their Risen Friend. A lasting gift Jesus gave his own: to share his bread, his loving cup. Whatever burdens may bow us down, he by his Cross shall lift us up.

And after Supper he washed their feet for service, too, is sacrament.

In him our joy shall be made complete – sent out to serve, as he was sent.

No end there is! We depart in peace, he loves beyond the uttermost: in every room in our Father's house he will be there as Lord and Host..

If the hymn has finished and the priest is still saying the Offertory Prayers the people respond:

#### Blessed be God for ever.

(STAND) Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

The priest says the Prayer over the Gifts to which all respond: **Amen.** 

## The Eucharistic Prayer
