To us Christ is all!

In today's encounter with the Pharisees, Jesus tells them that they are hypocrites: "they honour God with their lips but their heart is far from God"; they obey the Law and the traditions, not to please God, but to be seen and admired by others; their motive, self-glorification, impairs every other good act they perform. Christ then addresses the people — the crowds who most likely had overheard his dialog with the Pharisees — and he tells them that it is not legal or cultic uncleanliness that matters, but cleanliness of the heart before God. Eating with unwashed hands, or using unwashed vessels for drinking, does not defile us, this does not make us less worthy before God. It is not from things outside us that we incur defilement but from our own inner being. Every serious sin against God and neighbour has its beginning within us, in our intellect and will; the evil design is the forerunner and instigator of the evil deed

The Pharisees knew very well that before a man breaks any of the commandments of God he must first plan and decide to break it; it was not their theology that was defective but their practice. They despised their neighbours and called others "sinners," because through ignorance they violated many of the man-made precepts the Pharisees had added to the Law of Moses. There were also those who violated the law itself, but it was not their right to judge or condemn much less excommunicate them, as they so often did in practice

Christ was merciful, kind and understanding to all sinners. He forgave sin and promised forgiveness to all who would repent of their past misdeeds. He left to his followers for all time his sacrament of mercy and forgiveness, by means of which they could have their sins forgiven by his minister, acting in his name. Should we ever forget all he has done for us and disobey in a serious way any of his commandments, let us remember that we are not excluded from his company as the sinners were excluded by the Pharisees: we may shut the door on ourselves but Christ has given us the key with which to reopen it. Let us never be so foolish as to fail to use that key.

Welcome to the Parish Church where, after the example of the early Church, we celebrate the Eucharist: the "apostles' teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42)

Reception of Holy Communion: All Baptised and Confirmed Christians are encouraged to receive Holy Communion. At Dupused and Communications are chosen aged to receive Holy Communion. If you are unwell or uncertain about receiving the Precious Blood please do still receive the Host. Our Chalice Assistants are not authorised to permit the intincting (dipping) of the Host.



Safeguarding: Our Parish Churches have adopted and follow the Diocese of Oxford's recommended policies for the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults. The Responsorial Psalm (from Psalm 15)

R/. The just will live in the presence of the Lord.

to the supper of the Lamb. ★ Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

An antiphon and/or hymns may be sung quietly as the people reverently receive Holy Communion. It is customary to kneel throughout the distribution of Holy Communion except when going forward to receive the Blessed Sacrament and upon returning to your place.

Priest: Rejoicing in the fellowship of (*N* and of) all your saints, we commend ourselves and the whole of creation to your unfailing love. Merciful Father, **accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Gifts of Bread and Wine are brought to the altar by the faithful. Then priest says the Offertory Prayers as we sing a hymn (either standing or sitting). A collection is taken and brought forward.

O thou who camest from above the fire celestial to impart, kindle a flame of sacred love on the mean altar of my heart!

There let it for thy glory burn with inextinguishable blaze, and trembling to its source return in humble prayer and fervent praise.

Jesus, confirm my heart's desire to work, and speak, and think for thee; still let me guard the holy fire, and still stir up the gift in me.

Ready for all thy perfect will, my acts of faith and love repeat; till death thy endless mercies seal, and make the sacrifice complete.

If the hymn has finished and the priest is still saying the Offertory Prayers the people respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

(STAND) Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father. **May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.**

The priest says the Prayer over the Gifts to which all respond: **Amen.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest sings a Eucharistic Preface appropriate to the celebration, after which all join in the acclamation: (KNEEL)

When said, and at All Saints:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

When sung at SMSG: (Page 5 of Mass Setting)

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full, are full of your glory. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes,

who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest.

The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer of thanksgiving, recalling the command of Jesus Christ, 'Do this in memory of me.'

Priest: The mystery of faith: (Page 5 of Mass Setting at SMSG)

All: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues with the priest interceding for the Church, the world, all those present at this celebration, and the Faithful Departed. At the Doxology at the end of the
