

St. Mark records the episode where Christ's apostles are scandalised by the thought of his death, because they could not, from a pre-resurrection perspective, comprehend let alone be thankful for the divine redemptive plan. However, St Mark adds some words of Christ which illustrate what practical form our appreciation and gratitude for Christ's sufferings should take. We are called to be ready to follow him on the road to Calvary, to deny ourselves deprive ourselves not only of sinful pleasure or gain, but even of lawful things at times, in order to be Christ-like. We are to take up our cross and follow him. This doesn't mean that we go searching for crosses — there are plenty of them in any good Christian's life - but rather we are to bear those crosses that life brings us, for through them we come to a deeper understanding of God's love for us, and of his power to save.

Christ calls us to prepare, in this life, for eternity through the practice of sacrificial love after his example of letting go of self...

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Gifts of Bread and Wine are brought to the altar by the faithful. Then priest says the Offertory Prayers as we sing a hymn (either standing or sitting). A collection is taken and brought forward.

Take up thy cross, the Saviour said, if thou wouldst my disciple be; deny thyself, the world forsake, and humbly follow after me.

Take up thy cross then in his strength, and calmly every danger brave, 'twill guide thee to a better home, and lead to victory o'er the grave.

If the hymn has finished and the priest is still saying the Offertory Prayers the people respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

(STAND) Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

The priest says the Prayer over the Gifts to which all respond: **Amen.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest sings a Eucharistic Preface appropriate to the celebration, after which all join in the acclamation: (KNEEL)

When said, and at All Saints:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

When sung at SMSG:

(Page 5 of Mass Setting)

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full, are full of your glory. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes,

who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest.

The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer of thanksgiving, recalling the command of Jesus Christ, 'Do this in memory of me.'

Priest: The mystery of faith: (Page 5 of Mass Setting at SMSG)

All: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues with the priest interceding for the Church, the world, all those present at this celebration,
