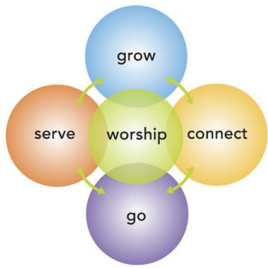

*Welcome to the Parish Church where, after the example of the early church, we celebrate the Eucharist: the "apostles teaching and fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42)*

In the first reading at today's Mass, we are given the story of the first General Council ever held by the Church authorities. We hear that a vital decision was reached through the guidance and assistance of the Holy Spirit. "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and ours" (Acts 15:28) was how the Apostles and Elders announced the conclusion they had reached.

In this Gospel reading Christ promised his Apostles, the night before his death, that when he returned to the Father, the Holy Spirit would be sent to them. He would teach them all things and recall to their minds all that Christ had taught them. In other words, the Church, through the Apostles, was promised the direct assistance of the Holy Spirit in preserving and interpreting what we call "the deposit of faith" or the sum total of the divine revelation given to us for our sanctification.

That promise was fulfilled in a very solemn way within twenty years of our Lord's resurrection at the Council of Jerusalem. It has been fulfilled again and again down through the history of the Church, as The Church met in the General Councils, and on many less solemn occasions. Bishop Jonathan's presence with us this morning is a vital sign of the real link, the Apostolic Succession, between the first Apostles and their current successors: the Bishops who hand on "the faith once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3).

The Holy Spirit "breathes where he wills." He assists the local Church, gathered around its Bishop. He inspires individual Christians if they call on him in their need. He inspires young people to offer their lives to the service of the Church and their neighbour. He inspired founders of orders and congregations to form institutes which would help the spread of the faith. He is at work today among us and among all the children of the Church, helping and inspiring us all towards that unity for which Christ prayed.

There are moments of crisis in all our lives, moments when a vital decision has to be made. If that decision is wrongly made it may not only seriously interfere with our earthly welfare, but more important still jeopardise our eternal salvation. We should call on the Holy Spirit to help us daily, but we should call for his assistance especially when we have a serious decision to make.

The Holy Spirit's role in the Church and in the lives of all Christians is to preserve and protect the revelation that God has given us. There are times in the lives of many of us when we are tempted to doubt about what we are called on to believe, or to hesitate with regard to what we are called on to do. It is on such occasions that the help of the Holy Spirit is especially necessary. He will not fail us if we turn to him earnestly and sincerely.

**Our Church School - News:** The Local Authority has asked our school if we are prepared to merge with Queen Eleanor primary School and run St. Mary & St. Giles School on both sites. This is potentially the biggest change in our school for many years and the Governing Body has agreed for this to go forward for consultation.

Why is the Authority proposing this change? Queen Eleanor Primary School is currently an improving school and St. Mary & St. Giles is judged to be outstanding by Ofsted. Kieran has stated that he is very excited by this proposal as he believes it to be in the best long-term interests of pupils and staff.
