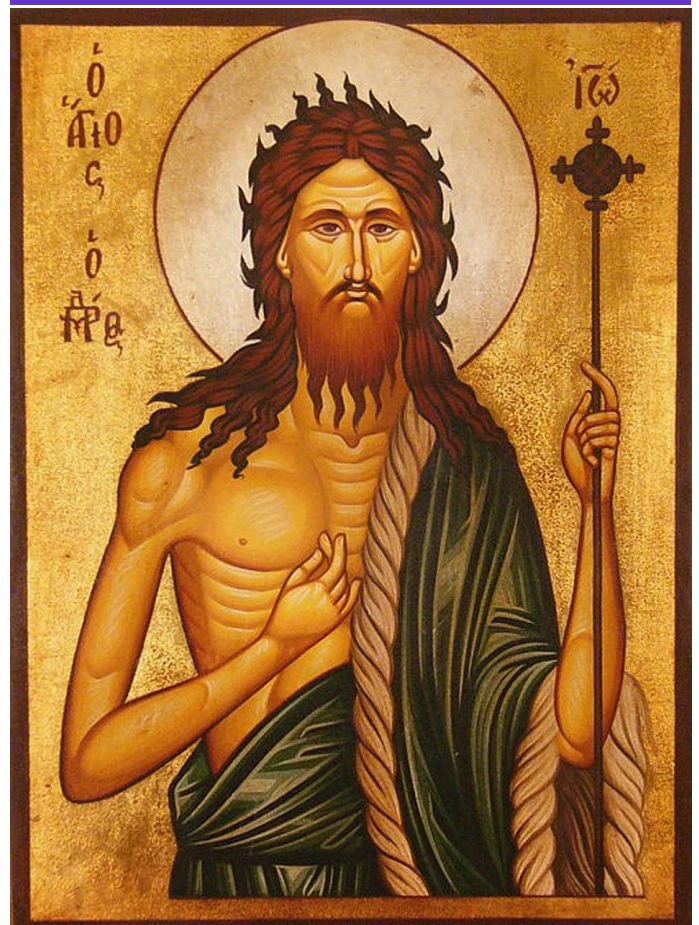

Access for the Disabled at St Mary & St Giles is via the path on the north side of the church. **At All Saints** it is via the South Porch.



Gluten-Free Hosts: if you are on a Gluten-Free diet and would like a Gluten-Free Host when you receive Holy Communion please mention this before Mass to one of the Sidesmen who will arrange this for you. Please make yourself known to the Parish Priest so that he is aware of your need.



Collections: for the continuing mission of Christ are taken while the altar and gifts of bread and wine are being prepared. If you are a visitor and a taxpayer and would like to make a donation please use the Gift Aid envelopes provided at the end of each row - please fill in your details. This enables us to reclaim, from the Inland Revenue, 25p for every £1 donated.



We observe a period of quiet prayer and reflection before the celebration of Mass, between the end of the Organ Voluntary and the Sacristy Bell being rung, in order that we may be better prepared to worship almighty God.

Reception of Holy Communion: All Baptised and Confirmed Christians are encouraged to receive Holy Communion. If you are unwell or uncertain about receiving the Precious Blood please do still receive the Host. Our Chalice Assistants are not authorised to permit the intincting (dipping) of the Host.

The Homily

THE BAPTISM OF INFANTS

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The candidates are presented to the congregation. Where appropriate, they are presented by their godparents or sponsors.

The priest addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome *these children/candidates* and uphold *them* in *their* new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

The priest asks the parents and godparents:

Children who are too young to profess the Christian faith are baptized on the understanding that they are brought up as Christians within the family of the Church. As they grow up, they need the help and encouragement of that family, so that they learn to be faithful in public worship and private prayer, to live by trust in God, and come to confirmation. Parents and godparents, the [child] whom you have brought for baptism depends chiefly on you for the help and encouragement [s/he] needs. Are you willing to give it to [him/her] by your prayers, by your example, and

**hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.**

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever.

Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Agnus Dei (KNEEL)

When sung at SMSG: (Page 8 of Mass Setting)

Jesus, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Jesus, Bread of Life, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Jesus, Cup of Hope, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Jesus, Prince of Peace, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Jesus, Word of Love, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Jesus, Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

The priest shows the consecrated Host to the people, saying:

Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called
to the supper of the Lamb.

✠ **Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

An antiphon and/or hymns may be sung quietly as the people reverently receive Holy Communion. It is customary to kneel throughout the distribution of Holy Communion except when going forward to receive the Blessed Sacrament and upon returning to your place.

Prayer after Communion (STAND)

Let us pray.

And all pray in silence with the Priest for a while, unless the silence has just been observed. Then the priest, with hands extended, says the Prayer after Communion; at the end of which the people acclaim: Amen.

All then pray:

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through

at his coming, let us pray to the Lord:

Priest:

Almighty, ever-living God,
your will for mankind is that none should be lost
and that all should be saved.
Hear the prayers of your people, guide the course of
the world in your peace,
and let your Church serve you in tranquillity and joy.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Gifts of Bread and Wine are brought to the altar by the faithful. Then priest says the Offertory Prayers as we sing a hymn (either standing or sitting). A collection is taken and brought forward. If the hymn has finished and the priest is still saying the Offertory Prayers the people respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

(STAND) Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours
may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

**May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for
the praise and glory of his name,
for our good and the good of all his Church.**

The priest says the Prayer over the Gifts to which all respond:
Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest sings a Eucharistic Preface appropriate to the celebration, after which all join in the acclamation: (KNEEL)

When sung at SMSG: (Page 5 of Mass Setting)

**Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts.
Heaven and earth are full, are full of your glory.
Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes,
who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in the highest.**

The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer of thanksgiving, recalling the command of Jesus Christ, 'Do this in memory of me.'

Priest: The mystery of faith:

(Page 5 of Mass Setting at SMSG)

**All: We proclaim your Death, O Lord,
and profess your Resurrection
until you come again.**

The Eucharistic Prayer continues with the priest interceding for the Church, the world, all those present at this celebration, and the Faithful Departed. At the Doxology at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer all join in the Great Amen.

(Page 7 of Mass Setting at SMSG)

Priest:for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

THE COMMUNION RITE

The Lord's Prayer

The priest introduces the Lord's Prayer: (STAND)

Our Father, who art in heaven,

by your teaching?

I am willing.

THE DECISION

The priest addresses candidates through their parents, godparents and sponsors:

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?
I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?
I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?
I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?
I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?
I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?
I come to Christ.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate with the Oil of Catechumens, saying:

Christ claims you for his own.

✠ Receive the sign of his cross.

When all have been signed, the priest says:

Do not be ashamed to confess
the faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

THE PRAYER OVER THE WATER

The ministers and candidates gather at the baptismal font. The priest stands before the water of baptism and says:

Praise God who made heaven and earth,
who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give him thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the promised land. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify ✕ this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The priest addresses the congregation, saying:

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with *these candidates* the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

The priest dips each candidate in water, or pours water on them, saying:

Luke Roy John, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The priest then anoints each child on the head with the Oil of Chrism, saying:

God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people. He now anoints ✕ you with the Chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life. **Amen.**

Each of the newly baptized is given a candle lit from the Paschal Candle. When all the newly baptized have received a candle, the priest says:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light.

You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

The priest then clothes each child in a white robe signifying the new life they have entered upon, saying:

You have become a new creature, clothed in Christ. See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, may you gain everlasting

life. **Amen.**

The priest says the following prayer:

Faithful and loving God, bless those who care for *these children* and grant them your gifts of love, wisdom and faith. Pour upon them your healing and reconciling love, and protect their home from all evil. Fill them with the light of your presence and establish them in the joy of your kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE WELCOME

The newly baptized are welcomed as members of the Body of Christ, the Church:

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: *N*, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The congregation may greet the newly baptized.

The Prayer of the Faithful (STAND)

Priest:

My brothers and sisters, as we prepare for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us ask him to come again to our world today, bringing salvation to all who stand in need.

Intercessor:

That the Lord Jesus may be with his Church to guide it always, and to enrich with spiritual gifts our bishop *N*. with all those who serve the Lord..... Let us pray to the Lord:

V/. Lord, hear us.

R/. **Lord, graciously hear us.**

That the Lord Jesus may bless the world with his peace and the protection of his love, and that he may guide those in authority to seek his will and the good of all mankind..... Let us pray to the Lord:

That the Lord Jesus may keep us true to our faith in him and help us to witness to his love for all people..... Let us pray to the Lord:

That the Lord Jesus may heal the sick, rid the world of hunger and protect us from all disasters...
