

INFORMATION



Safeguarding: Our Parish Churches have adopted and follow the Diocese of Oxford's recommended policies for the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults. Details of these policies and of our Safeguarding Officers are available on the noticeboards inside each Parish Church. Should you have any safeguarding concerns then please see one of them.

Restrictions During the Current Pandemic:

Unfortunately, we are required to observe the following restrictions:

- ◆ **FACE MASKS: MUST BE WORN** by all attending worship as required by Law, apart from the Priest and any Lay Ministers assisting him. **N.B. IF YOU CANNOT WEAR A MASK FOR MEDICAL REASONS YOU MUST WEAR A FACE SHIELD.**
- ◆ Only 3 or 4 **Church Bells** are permitted to be rung, because ringing chambers are not large enough for distancing requirements when a full team is present. The Tower Captain and Assistant must keep a record of who is present to ring on what dates and ensure that distancing is maintained on the staircase. Bell ringing practice is not permitted.
- ◆ **Entry and exit** to our Parish Churches - entry via the West (Tower) Door and exit via the Parish Hall at St Mary & St Giles - entry via the South Porch and exit via the West (Tower) Door at All Saints
- ◆ There cannot be an **social gathering** in either of our Parish Churches before or after Mass - brief social intercourse may take place in the churchyards before or after Mass.
- ◆ 'Shared' **Mass cards** are not permitted. Please do not take a copy for someone else - either retain it for your devotions at home, or place it in the bin provided at the exit points in both churches.
- ◆ Until further notice all **communal singing**, singing rehearsals and concerts are prohibited in all places of worship. It is now possible to have a small choir and Organ Music played - a recessional hymn may be sung within the churchyard.
- ◆ **Collections:** Cash donations and envelopes must be placed either in the large plinth donations box at St Mary & St Giles, or in the bowl by the south porch door at All Saints. We are not allowed to pass a collection plate/bag to one another.
- ◆ 'The Peace' may not be shared physically. We may however join our own hands and bow to each other at The Peace, whilst saying the customary greeting.
- ◆ **When going forward to receive Holy Communion** - at St Mary & St Giles please approach centre of the altar rail in single file via the main aisle, observing a two metre distance, and return to your place via the side aisle. At All Saints: again single file two metres apart but keeping to the south porch side of the main aisle on approaching the altar rail and returning to your place on the vestry side. N.B. in both churches Holy Communion must be received whilst standing and please extend your arms as far as you are able. Textile kneelers and cushions have had to be removed.
- ◆ '**Receiving Holy Communion**' is in one kind, i.e. The Host. This must be received in the palms of our hands - not on the tongue.
- ◆ **Please maintain a two metre distance** from each other on approaching the altar rails and on leaving our churches after Mass.
- ◆ **Lavatory Facilities.** Strict hand-hygiene must be observed and hand-dryers only used. In the lavatory at each church there is a spray sanitiser and single use sanitising wipes for each user to wipe the seat, flush-handle, water taps, sink and door handle. Used wipes should be placed in the waste baskets provided.

All of these restrictions, whilst not what we would wish for, do not detract from the fact that we are able to receive the Lord in his Blessed Sacrament.

Once the exterior works are complete, which is now expected to be by the 25th July, the PCC, when funds permit, wishes to complete the desk work to the east wall of the Parish Office; comprising a taller unit for the parish photocopier - with paper kept above it - space for the filing cabinet along with an extension to the desk. The Parish Office will then gradually become the office from which Parish Administration takes place.

Delay to the Easing of Restrictions: as expected there is now a delay to easing all restrictions due to COVID-19, and although the new date of the 19th July is being called a 'Terminus Date' the following group activities and events must be understood to be 'subject to' those restrictions being eased.

Squeals on Wheels - our weekly Toddler Group will resume on Monday 26th July in The Parish Hall from 9:30 - 11am. Parents/Grandparents/Carers are welcome to bring their children from birth to preschool age (and their siblings in the school holidays) to stay and play. We are a small informal group that encourages children and adults to play together and share support and friendship. Hot and cold drinks and biscuits will be served and there is no charge. We are open every Monday, except Bank Holidays. We look forward to seeing you.

Coffee Morning - We hope to be delighted to hold our first Coffee Morning for many months on Saturday 7th August. Come and join us in The Parish Hall (or Parish Church if the Hall is still needed due to the building works) from 10:00am - 12:00noon for a hot drink and delicious home-made cake and great company. Do also stop off at the High Street door to see what's on offer on our stall full of interesting items. We hope to make the first Saturday of the month coffee morning a tradition once again.

Classic Car Festival - Sunday, 4th July. As part of *Stony Live!* week, Stony Stratford will be full of classic cars on this day. We are planning to serve refreshments in The Churchyard to the many visitors this event will bring. If you can make small cakes for this event or help serve on the day, please let Lesley Salter know as soon as possible (07789 898847).

From the Rector: During Stony Live Week we have always take the opportunity to raise money for the Restoration Fund. However, the PCC has agreed that we will now have a separate fund for Specific Projects such as the 'Greater Access Project' as well as a Fabric Fund for each of our Parish Churches. As we will have emptied the Fabric Fund to cover the cost of essential repairs to the Parish Office and Sacristy, this year monies raised in Stony Live Week will go to the Fabric Fund. It is always a good thing for such a fund to have a healthy balance in case of emergencies, and so we need to build this fund up again.

Music - Lunchtime Organ Recitals and Third Thursday @ Twelve-Thirty concerts will, we hope, resume very soon. They will be advertised in the weekly sheet and on posters in and outside the church.

Parish Weekend Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham: a pilgrimage has been arranged with the Shrine for the weekend of the 30th July to 1st August. We have been allotted up to 20 places. Booking forms are available in both churches. A deposit of £30.00 is required at the time of booking - which will, of course, be deducted from the full cost of the Pilgrimage Accommodation, which



when parish accounts are sent in annually and where possible appropriate the bequests where the wording is not legally watertight in safeguarding it for a Parish Church. Therefore, when drawing up your 'Last Will and Testament' it is important to use these words for our Parish Churches:

- For St Mary & St Giles: 'I leave the sum of £... (*or property address or possessions*) to be used at the sole discretion of the Incumbent and Churchwardens for the time being of the Parish Church of St Mary & St Giles, Stony Stratford with Calverton.'
- For All Saints: 'I leave the sum of £... (*or property address or possessions*) to be used at the sole discretion of the Incumbent and Churchwardens for the time being of the Parish Church of All Saints, Stony Stratford with Calverton.'

The phrase 'for the time being' also ensures that the Incumbent and Churchwardens at the time the bequest is received do not receive it personally, but by virtue of their Office for the benefit of the said Parish Church.

RAISE THE ROOF

Donate a Tile in Memory of a Loved One: Unfortunately, it has become clear that all the roof tiles on roofs of the Sacristy and the Parish Office will need to be replaced. It is not quite clear how and when this happened, but the 'lugs' that hold the tiles on the batons have worn away and, in addition, at some point the tiles became 'fired on' - which may have happened in one of two ways. Either the fire in 1964 caused the tiles to adhere to one another, or, to reduce the cost of replacing the roof tiles after the fire, the tiles were heated so that they adhered to one another. The budget had allowed for up to 60% of the tiles to be replaced, as would normally be expected, but unfortunately none of the present tiles can be used again.

We are attempting to seek additional grants, but that may prove difficult. Therefore, it has been suggested that we seek donations per tile in memory of a loved one. The Rector will produce a list of the names so commemorated suitable to be framed and hung on a wall in the lobby outside the Parish Office for all to see.

Following the launch of this initiative on Sunday 6th June several donations have already been received. It has been suggested that we also open this initiative to a wider group who don't necessarily want to make a donation in memory of a departed loved one, but who would like to make a donation as a Benefactor. In the same way as is intended to commemorate those that tiles have been donated in memory of, it has been suggested that we create a list of Benefactors and also the Grant Making Organisations that have helped us. At the time of producing the Mass Sheet we had already received £505.00 of the £6000.00 extra funding we need to complete the project - *Thank you*.

There are now two types of forms to donate tiles available in church: the new 'Benefactors' Form and the ones previously issued containing space for the donation of individual tiles in memory of up to ten loved ones and the donation requested for each tile supplied and fitted is £4.99. The completed forms with cash or cheque (payable to 'The PCC of Stony Stratford with Calverton') donations can be handed to either Bob Scarff or Fr Ross. There is also the option of electronic transfer, as the PCC Bank Details are included on the form. You may also know of relations,

PARISH NOTICES

The Sick List & Anniversaries of Death: I would be grateful if I could have an update on the condition of all those we are praying for on the Sick List, so that I am able to keep it as accurate as possible.

I shall be updating the Memorial Registers in both churches at the end of this month. If you desire that names be added, so that loved ones can be prayed for on the Anniversary of their Deaths do please let me know their full name and the date of their deaths. Thank you. Fr Ross

The Reception of Holy Communion at Home: A number of our regular worshippers receive the Blessed Sacrament at home due to been unable to get to Mass because of long-term illness or issues regarding personal mobility. Since March 23rd last year, they have been unable to receive visits from me due to the Restrictions. However, now that I have been double-vaccinated and passed the period to make it fully effective, and with the current Step 3 in place, they will be able to receive the Blessed Sacrament for the first time in almost 15 months. This week I intend to arrange for them to receive Holy Communion as soon as possible. Please pray for them, and also for those in Care Homes across Milton Keynes that I take Holy Communion to so as to maintain their links with our parish - something that they value immensely.

Funeral Arrangements & Making a Bequest in your 'Last Will & Testament: I am convinced that all of you have got a lot of living to do yet ! However, it is not unknown that regular worshippers in parishes are denied the Funeral Service that they would want for themselves, as families or executors do what they would 'like' to happen. All priests can tell you of examples, some quite distressing, where the known funeral wishes of a regular worshipper have been completely ignored. Therefore, it is my strong advice that everyone does two things: firstly, to have your funeral plans added to your 'Last Will and Testament,' and secondly, to let me have a copy of those wishes to keep on file. Fr Cavell kindly left such a file for me, but after 23 plus years it is now quite thin. Recent experiences have led me to draw your attention to this important matter.

Often those making bequest to the Parish Church in their 'Wills' simply leave to the 'Parish Church of' However, that does not guarantee that the bequest will necessarily remain with the Parish Church. It is not unknown for 'officials' in some parts of the Church to look at bequests

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

*The Gifts of Bread and Wine are placed upon the altar, as the priest says the **Offertory Antiphon:***

O hold thou up my goings, O Lord, in thy own paths, that unmoved be my footsteps. Incline thine ears to me and hearken to my words. Show to me thy loving kindness, who art the Saviour of them that trust in thee, O Lord.

Then priest says the Offertory Prayers to which the people respond:
Blessed be God for ever.

(STAND) Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

The priest says the Prayer over the Offerings:

Receive, O Lord, the sacrifice of conciliation and praise and grant that, cleansed by its action, we may make offering of a heart pleasing to you. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*The priest sings a Eucharistic Preface appropriate to the celebration,
after which all join in the acclamation:* (KNEEL)

heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

*The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer of thanksgiving, recalling
the command of Jesus Christ, 'Do this in memory of me.'*

Priest: The mystery of faith:

**All: We proclaim your Death, O Lord,
and profess your Resurrection
until you come again.**

*The Eucharistic Prayer continues with the priest interceding for the
Church, the world, all those present at this celebration, and the Faith-
ful Departed. At the Doxology at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer all
join in the Great Amen.*

Priest:for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

THE COMMUNION RITE

The Lord's Prayer

The priest introduces the Lord's Prayer. (STAND)

**Our Father,
who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.**

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant
peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy we may
be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we
await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Je-
sus Christ.

**For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now
and for ever.**

Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave
you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the
faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and
unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for
ever and ever. **Amen.**
